
God's work. Our hands.

Emergency Cold Weather Shelter



"Loaves and Fishes."

That was the comment from our dear friend Rev. Marcia Wakeland when she saw the photos of the beds for In Our Backyard. It just made my heart smile, because that is what is happening with this project. People making connections to reach out and help, unexpected doors opening and renewed faith when I get



discouraged. Thanks to my husband Michael Graham for driving to Palmer to pick up the beds. Thanks to Dave Kuiper from Christian Health Associates for connecting us to the bed donation. The bed frames and mattress are from the Arctic Winter Games, which were funded by the Rasmuson Foundation.

I was honored to present at the Alaska Synod gathering at Gloria Dei. Our project received lots of encouragement from churches around Alaska. Connections were made that will lead to building ideas, ways to engage the community, and funding sources.

The board is working on forming relationships with other nonprofits and social service agencies engaged in helping people who are living unsheltered in the community and on seeking funding for In Our Backyard. We are also anticipating that an Anchorage Ordinance allowing Shelter Units will be laid on the table at the May 7th meeting.

So, a couple of big asks from our faith community:

- Donate to raise funds for the restroom/shower trailer. We need to place an order by mid May in order for the trailer to be shipped to Seattle by September. From there, it will be barged to Alaska. The estimated cost is \$60,000.
- Send emails to the Assembly letting them know that you support the AO on <u>Shelter Units Located in Community Shelter</u> <u>Camps</u>. Randy Sulte has been the Assembly Member working on this. Thank him for being an advocate.

- **Pray for guidance and patience**, and for the people living unsheltered who need a safe place to be.





This month's Kuwaa Mission Prayer Letter comes from one of the three Kuwaa Mission-sponsored evangelists at the Louis T. Bowers Lay Leaders and Ministers Training Center (LTB-LLMTC) in Totota, Bong County, Liberia.



Prince Kollie completed his training at the training center in February of this year. He wrote this letter of thanks before the graduation ceremony.

Like his classmates and all others before him, Prince volunteered to travel several hundred miles away from home and family to be better prepared to minister to his people. This venture was a dream come true for Prince, thanks to the Kuwaa Mission. The decision to travel away from home and family for nine weeks at a time, four times in two years, is a testimony to his faith. He did not only travel away from his family; he, like his colleagues, abandoned his farming activities at crucial periods in the farming season, exposing his family to the possibility of experiencing hunger. (We thank God that some congregations provide minimum farming help to their evangelists while they are at school).



Prince writes: Dear Kuwaa Mission and Friends of Kuwaa Mission, I thank God for all of you! I am Evangelist Prince K. Kollie from Marvordor Town, a member of St. Peter Lutheran Church, Kuwaa Parish. I am married. My wife and I brought five children into this world, but we also have other children living with us who are children of our relatives. They are our children, too.

Growing up in my little town, I never thought of becoming anything in the church. I can only say it was the call of God that led me to become an evangelist. Because of my little



education, I was asked to read the Bible to my friends several times. Before long, I started reading in church during worship services. Then, I started to love the Bible stories. So, I started reading the Bible stories so that I could teach them in Sunday school. And the congregation started to call on me more and more to read and tell the Bible stories. God started to speak to me through these stories because I just loved them, and I loved telling them! It was hard to leave home for Totota in one way, but in another, it was easy. I wanted to help my wife produce food for the family. It was hard to leave her alone with the children. However, being trained for the Gospel Ministry is something I have dreamed of for a long time. I thank God for calling me, and I thank you, Kuwaa Mission, for helping me become a better interpreter of God's Word. May God bless you, and God bless your work among us! Amen!


