Alice Marie Bebow Bethka passed away on May 21, 2023, at age 90. Alice was born in St Louis, Michigan in 1933 to Martin and Iva Bebow, the second of five children. While still in high school, she met the love of her life, Richard Bethka, at a roller-skating event. When he enlisted in the Air Force at the end of World War II and was sent to Japan, Alice attended Cleary College Business School. Richard and Alice married in 1955 and went on to have 4 children: Jon, Steve, Teresa and Tracy. They lived in several states moving from Michigan to Washington, then to Alabama, Colorado and finally Alaska. They also hosted a foreign exchange student, Isabelle Evern, who became an "adopted" daughter.

As a newlywed, Alice worked at Michigan State University as a secretary. While her children were growing up, she worked at various schools in the Anchorage School District, so she could be home when they were not in school. Then she became a real estate agent and finished her career as an appraiser for the federal government at Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Alice was best known for her ability to grow plants. She spent many happy hours in her garden, sold plants with her neighbor Paul and was an active member of the Alaska Wildflower Club. She instilled a love of gardening in her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren who loved to pick raspberries and vegetables from her backyard. After moving to Chester Park,



Alice held plant sales to raise money for the gardens, was on the gardening committee and took care of 20 plants in the common areas of her floor.

In her 90 years, Alice held a strong faith in Christ and was a long-time member of Central Lutheran Church. She loved to create many crafts including making quilts, carving, sewing clothes, beading, and tatting. Alice was proud to be a blood donor, giving a record number of pints of blood as she had a rare blood type. She also enjoyed nature, spending many days picking berries, camping, boating and hiking with her family and friends. She was a great fisherwoman, often catching the largest fish.

Alice lived a wonderful and full life, enjoying every minute of her 90 years. She had a generous spirit and was loved by everyone she met. She was often a "mother" to the various friends of her children and a great friend to her neighbors. As the matriarch of her family, she will be missed by her 4 children, 11 grandchildren, and 11 great grandchildren. Alice is survived by two of her siblings, Ted Bebow and Kathy Butler, her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. In memorial of Alice, the family asks you to plant a flower this summer and remember her every time you see it.
