I hope you all had a wonderful July and were able to enjoy the weather, the extra daylight hours, possible visits from family and friends, and the unusually good fishing season we have been blessed with this year.

I know it probably raises concerns when the Council President and Church Treasurer suddenly take off together to a remote location somewhere in the world, but rest assured, we are back and the money is still in the bank! At Kathy Dale's invitation, I joined her for a most remarkable trip to Iceland, the Land of Fire and Ice. For thirteen amazing days, we were immersed in a world of culture, history, nature and folklore. We hiked in fields, lava fields and on glaciers; got up close and personal with puffins and whales; rode Icelandic horses; walked a minimum of 10,000 steps each day, and that was only before lunch! We swam in the Blue Lagoon, soaked in

another natural hot springs, and also in another lagoon, which leads me to say that we always seemed to be "in hot water" with someone! While we were there, as if on cue, the Grindavik

I was unable to get a letter drafted following our June 15 Council meeting, but it was pretty much business as usual. Of note:

- Central was awarded the 20 solar panels for which we applied, so those who pledged to support this project will be contacted for payment soon. Thank you to all who agreed to participate. Hopefully, this will enable us to defray our energy cost.
- The Financial Review Committee has completed its review, and the report will be presented to the Council at the August meeting.
- We still have issues with campers on our property. Hank Koegel is working on drafting a flyer to be given to would-be campers stating our policy, and he and John Bulkow will coordinate with Kathy Freeman to get this out. Because we have a policy in place, it is imperative that we enforce it. I know none of us like to be the one to confront those who have tried to set up camp here, but unless we enforce it, it might as well not exist. This is a matter of concern to us all. We don't have the resources to be able to hire a security team, so enforcement needs to come from the membership. This is our church, our property, our home and our community and we need to protect it as we would our own homes. Please contact any one of the Council members if you would be willing to serve on the enforcement team.
- Volunteers are always needed to staff the Clothes Closet. Julie Graham volunteered to contact members of other congregations to see if anyone would be interested in helping us keep this much needed and appreciated project going.

I would be remiss if I did not address the void left by the passing our Carol Norquist. Carol was in institution here at Central, as well as in many other places. She was a wealth of information – her mind retained everything, and if we had a question, we all continues next page

knew Carol had the answer. I will remember her for many things, but the image that sticks with me the most was seeing her watering the plants around the church on Sundays as I was leaving. She loved gardening, and could always be found planting, watering, or otherwise tending to a plant somewhere. Rest in peace, Carol.

meeting. We need to be ever vigilant and be proactive.


